We completed a remarkable summer. This year, while war and tragedy continued in our Jewish homeland, we widened our campgrounds to include more Israelis at Camp Maas: Over 200 campers and staff members enjoyed a peaceful landing at "The Greatest Place on Earth!" During these carefully contemplated initiatives, we stretched beyond our partnership region in Israel to invite campers from the Gaza Envelope. Additionally, to further our mission of sending kids to camp and meeting greatest needs, our generous community exclaimed, "Hineni" (here I am), providing more dollars for Send a Kid to Tamarack (SK2T) than at any time in our history — which also included young philanthropists who dedicated their mitzvah projects to SK2T. Also, our Camp Maas grounds were beautifully enhanced through transformational gifts from Harriet and Gregg Orley, Andi and Larry Wolfe, and the DeRoy Testamentary Foundation, allowing us to embrace the past, savor the present, and build for the future.

These initiatives — and so many more — provided a safe and inviting Jewish camping opportunity, connecting approximately 1,150 campers and 350 staff members, along with an "off season" that included about 10,000 more participants. We really are the community's flagpole.



Agree Outpost Camp — provided campers with an opportunity to unplug and experience the beauty of the Upper Peninsula and Wawa, Ontario. From paddling through tranquil lakes to learning wilderness skills, these experiences fostered independence and self-confidence in an environment surrounded by nature. And for those who traveled farther, Western and Alaska trips offered extraordinary adventures, where Shabbat under the stars and challenges like white-water rafting and glacier climbing gave campers a new perspective on their own strength and resilience.

## **JEWISH LIFE**

This summer, Jewish life at Tamarack Camps was a breath of fresh air, fostering connections to Israel and the global Jewish community. At the heart of this effort was a remarkable year for the **Elaine and Michael Serling Israeli Camper Program**, which was integral in bringing 138 Israeli campers to camp — our largest group since 2002. Teens from Kibbutz Gevim and Kibbutz Be'eri found a special place within our camp family, contributing to our vibrant, international Jewish tapestry.

For Israeli campers, Tamarack provided respite and the opportunity to simply be kids. We welcomed Israeli social workers to support these campers, as well as a record 70 Israeli staff. In addition, our **Teen Leadership Village (TLV)** Israeli campers enjoyed their six weeks with us in Ortonville instead of going to Israel, where they would typically experience part of their summer. This change, due to the ongoing conflict, strengthened the bonds within our camp community. Specially tailored activities offered a safe environment for everyone to share stories, heal, and form lasting connections with peers from diverse backgrounds.

Informal daily immersion and Jewish celebrations, including our **Schuchman Family Israel Day** and weekly Shabbat, infused camp life with meaningful traditions, connecting community to shared experiences that deepened Tamarack's commitment to living Jewishly. Through art projects that bring Judaism to life, thanks to the **Max M.** and **Marjorie S. Fisher Foundation Jewish Artist in Residence Program**, campfires and thoughtful programming, our campers celebrated together and forged friendships and everlasting connections that underscore Tamarack's role as a bridge between Jewish communities worldwide.



## YOUR IMPACT SEND A KID TO TAMARACK



Our annual fundraising event, Send a Kid to Tamarack (SK2T) was held at Temple Israel on May 8. Chaired by Lisa Korotkin Rothberger and Jeffrey Kirschner, along with VP of Advancement Elizabeth Sollish, 2024 was another record-breaking year! Both the attendance and contributions exceeded our goals - raising over \$760,000 with over 580 in attendance, to send children and teens to camp and support greatest needs.

The theme, "Together in One Voice," speaks to the Tamarack community's long history of standing with Israel. This year's honorees, Community Leaders Elaine and Michael Serling, and Distinguished Alumna, Naomi Miller, represent the legacy of our Israeli Camper Program beginning in 2002, and now, continuing for generations to come.

### THE HuG

Thanks to the generosity of Harriet and Gregg Orley, Tamarack campers embraced a new signature space called **"The HuG!"**This game-changing project features new and enhanced areas in the heart of Camp Maas. Campers and staff enjoyed beautiful views behind the *chadar ochel* (dining hall), where Adirondack chairs span an expansive patio — adding comfort, color and new opportunities to quietly connect. Additionally, *degal* (flagpole) was redesigned to better accommodate large gatherings in the round, evoking traditions of our beloved former campsite in Brighton. The HuG also boasts sheltered pergolas, perfectly sized for villages, bunks or smaller groups to congregate. Lastly, with a new location along our magnificent waterfront, the entire camp community witnessed the modernization of a covered amphitheater, which will be enjoyed for Shabbat, all-camp events, and a vibrant future of Jewish services and programs.

"Looking back, some of Harriet's best childhood memories were the years she spent at Tamarack Camps. Friendships from so many years past remain relevant and meaningful in her life. Gregg's great joy has been his synagogue allegiance and Shabbat attendance, which he has committed himself to for the last 40 years. Together, we have combined our recollections of the past and vision for the future into a new gathering place at Camp Tamarack, called The HuG. Wolfe Village also provides an opportunity to serve more community groups during the year.



# **OUR COMMUNITY'S CAMP**

#### COMMUNITY Heart Screening

In February, we marked American Heart Month by hosting our first heart screening event for camp families and the Detroit community. Over 100 young people received free heart screenings, thanks to volunteers from Henry Ford Health, the Jewish Federation of Detroit and Tamarack's medical team. The American Heart Association was also on hand to teach "Hands Only" CPR, adding a lifesaving skill for attendees.

Our 123rd summer began with the much-anticipated return of Family Fun Day — the first since 2019. More than 750 campers, future campers, staff, parents, grandparents and alumni gathered to enjoy classic camp activities and celebrate the Tamarack *ruach* (spirit). This vibrant kickoff filled our campgrounds — and our hearts — with warmth and anticipation for the summer ahead.

## FAMILY CAMPS

This year, Tamarack's family camps continued to bring together families of all ages for unforgettable weekends in the heart of camp. Through Bubbie Zaydie, Mom & Me, Dad & Me and congregational camps, nearly 800 parents, kids and grandparents enjoyed a rich mix of familyfriendly adventures, fostering connection and creating cherished memories across generations.
